Bangladesh's healthcare landscape is undergoing a profound transformation. Driven by rapid urbanization and a burgeoning middle class, the total market value—spanning pharmaceuticals, diagnostics, and medical infrastructure—has hit **\$14 billion**. Projections suggest a surge to **\$23 billion by 2030**.

This growth is fueled by:

- **Infrastructure Expansion:** A proliferation of private specialized hospitals and diagnostic hubs.

- **The Takeaway:** This heavy reliance on foreign markets serves as a massive "Buy Local" opportunity for Bangladeshi innovators and investors.
